


DETERMINING the DIAGNOSIS Hidradenitis Suppurativa (HS) Questionnaire & Screening Tools

HS Diagnostic Tool Question Topics

Types of Lesions¹

- >> Comedones
- >> Nodules
- » Abscesses
- >> Tunnels, sinus tracts, and/or fistulas
- Scarring

Identifying HS

Hurley Clinical Staging System⁴

Hurley classification is useful for rapid classification of HS severity, but it has limitations and is not a precise monitoring tool⁵

STAGE I

Abscess formation without sinus tracts, tunnels, and/or fistulas or scarring (cicatrization)

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STAGE II

- Recurrent abscesses with sinus tracts, tunnels, and/or fistulas
- >> Scarring
- Single or widely dispersed multiple lesions

MODERATE*





STAGE III

Diffuse or almost diffuse involvement

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Skin tunnels with multiple interconnected sinus tracts and abscesses across the entire area

SEVERE or REFRACTORY DISEASE*
